ELIGIBILITY

Adults (18 and older) who live, work or go to school full-time in Caldwell County.

ENTRY FEE

A non-refundable entry fee of \$10 entitles the artist to display up to two (2) works in this competition.

SPECIFICATIONS

- Artwork must be 2-dimensional (paintings, collage, etc.) or 3-dimensional (pottery, sculptural, etc.) and no older than one year. Photography is excluded from this exhibit.
- Works that are meant to hang on the wall must be framed or in a finished state and ready to hang (hooks and/or hanging wire attached) — no dry-mount or other temporary hanging formats.
- Installation pieces are welcome, but the artist must be available on Wednesday, September 30th to install with the hanging committee—or if there are special installation instructions, they should be attached to the piece; diagrams are helpful.
- Any piece previously exhibited with the Caldwell Arts Council will not be accepted.
- The Caldwell Arts Council reserves the right not to display every piece submitted. Any piece not fulfilling the criteria will be pulled from the exhibit and the entry fee will be forfeited.
- All works must remain in the gallery for the duration of the exhibit.
- Work should be delivered to the Caldwell Arts Council either Monday or Tuesday, September 28-29, 9am-5pm.
- Work should be picked up on Monday, November 2nd 9am-5pm.

JUDGE

Jerry Jackson, Deputy Director of Penland School of Crafts, holds MFA and BFA degrees in ceramics from East Carolina University and has spent the majority of his arts career as a curator and arts administrator. He is an active artist working in found-object assemblage, and has participated in over 100 group and solo exhibitions throughout the US, Finland, Germany and Estonia.

AWARDS

A public reception for the artists and judge will be held at the Caldwell Arts Council on Friday, October 2nd from 5:00-7:30pm. Everyone is invited to attend, and refreshments will be provided. Awards will be presented at 6pm.
